E. LAUC Advisory to UC Library Cooperative Groups

- 1. Systemwide Library and Scholarly Information Advisory Committee/SLASIAC (J. Chan)
 - i. SLASIAC met on the 30th. It is now official that access to Symplectic Elements, the backbone of the PMS, will receive funding support from UCOP, as well as receive one FTE funded by UCOP, to help support the system. CDL will provide one FTE from its budget to also support the PMS.
 - ii. Package negotiations by Ivy at CDL will be guided by a document currently in draft form, tentatively titled, "A Call to Action."
 - iii. DASH will now take on DRYAD branding and CDL will join the DRYAD E-Board.
- 2. Shared Libraries Facilities Board/SLFB (D. Schmitt)
 - i. We have not met or discussed any new business since the last LAUC conference call. The only new item is that the SLFB approved all of the campus deposit requests for 2018/2019 without any changes. This was announced to the campuses a couple of weeks ago.

 - ii. Retirements: Two major voids will be felt in July!! Cathy Chiu, East Asian Studies Librarian, is retiring after nearly 28 years of service and Linda Broderick, Special Collections Cataloger and Italian Librarian, is retiring after 48 years.

- i. Personnel: Courtney Jacobs started as Inaugural Head of Outreach & Community Engagement in Library Special Collections on June 4. Jillian Cuellar, Head of Collection Management for Library Special Collections, left UCLA on May 31. Her new position will be Head of Special Collections at Tulane University. Three UCLA librarians will retire on June 28: Kay Deeney, former LAUC-LA Chair; David Hirsch, 2013 UCLA Librarian of the Year; and Ken Wade, LAUC-LA Parliamentarian.
- ii. The LAUC-LA spring membership meeting was held on May 14.
- iii. Miki Goral received the Distinguished Alumni Award at the UCLA Library and Information Science Alumni Association (LISAA) 2018 Spring Awards Dinner on May 24.
- iv. University Librarian Ginny Steel was recently elected to serve on the OCLC Board of Trustees. She attended her first Board meeting last week.
- v. The UCLA Library Data Archive was a Library Carpentry Sprint site for the worldwide 2018 Mozilla Global Sprint hackathon, held May 10-11, https://foundation.mozilla.org/opportunity/global-sprint/.
- vi. Johanna Drucker, faculty member of the UCLA Department of Information Studies, gave the presentation *History of the Book Online Project* on May 16. The free online project explores the production and reception of materials related to the history of the book and literacy technologies, using examples from the UCLA collections and exhibits made by students working with Drucker, https://hob.gseis.ucla.edu/.
- vii. The UCLA Library awarded Prizes for Undergraduate Research at the annual Undergraduate Research Week on May 24, http://www.library.ucla.edu/support/support-students/showcasing-student-achievement/library-prize-undergraduate-research.
- viii. Several events are scheduled in conjunction with the UCLA East Asian Library's 70th anniversary: A lecture and workshop on Korean Romanization on June 5, a three-day workshop on the *History of the Book in China* June 13-15, and a June 8 screening of the Retrospective Film Exhibition of Xie Fei: *Song of Tibet* and *A Mongolian Tale*. Xie Fei is a world-renowned Chinese film director.
- ix. The UCLA Library Departments of Scholarly Communication and User Engagement introduced a new workshop series, *Scholarly Communication + Info Lit*. The first 90-minute session of the three-part series, *Scholarly Communication and the ACRL Framework*, will be held June 14.

4. UCSC

- i. Go live date for new LMS Alma/Primo is June 20th. Lots of training planned for staff. Discovery team is reaching out to faculty and students with information on <u>new search tool</u>.
- ii. New Grateful Dead Exhibit on the business of the GD "Put your gold money where your love is, baby": Counterculture, Capitalism, and the Grateful Dead. Soft opening event on 6/5 was very well attended. Will be open for the next year (at least).
- iii. CDL Mass digitization project: Scanning of Ruth-Marion Baruch photographs (around 5000 images) will begin 6/11. Photos will be available on Calisphere.
- iv. Digital Research Symposium on 5/23 included undergraduate poster sessions, presentations by undergraduate fellows, and round table on innovative pedagogy with faculty and grad students. About 50-60 people attended.

5. UCSD

- i. Biological Studies Librarian position posted.
- ii. The library partnered with the Triton Food Pantry, a campus organization that provides discreet service to students with food needs, and offered a Food for Fines initiative. Students who brought in cans or other food items received a credit against library fines of \$2 per item.

6. UCD

- i. Retirements:
 - 1. AUL of Administrative Services Helen Zaccari is retiring. Status of other retirements is unknown.

Recruitments:

- 1. New Director of Finance position will oversee budget only, not budget and HR as in current configuration.
- 2. Electronic Resources and Health Sciences librarian recruitments are in final stages.
- 3. The Endowed Wine Writer Collection Fellow should be progressing, with the exact recruitment status unknown.
- 4. Senior Director of Development position posted.
- 5. Non academic positions: OA analyst to replace Scholarly Communications Officer Mike Wolfe. Position will analyze content and likely support grant projects including the successor to the Pay-it-Forward project.
- ii. N&E committee has no candidates for Chair/Vice Chair for Davis despite much canvassing. No nominations were received from floor at the last general membership meeting, and a series of procedural votes were done to allow people who were currently serving in an office (I.e., Secretary) to stand for another term. UCD does not have provisions for pro tem appointments in its bylaws, so LAUC statewide bylaws will be relied on for making pro tem appointments. A membership meeting is scheduled in July to talk about continuity. If no one steps forward, Davis will have to rethink how it provides representation to the statewide Executive Board next year.
- iii. LAUC-D website document review led to a meeting seeking clarification from library administration about who is in charge of certain documents, in particular related to the librarian review process.
- iv. Program Committee had a well-attended Pathways to OA event with Mike Wolfe and Rachael Sandberg, who joined via Zoom from Berkeley.
- v. There was a well-attended reception on May 23rd for recipients of the <u>Norma J. Lang Prize for Undergraduate Information Research</u>. The display is featured in the lobby through the remainder of the quarter.
