- 2. LAUC committees' transition timeline: From the standing rules: 100.2 LAUC Year The LAUC year is the academic year, Sept. 1 through August 31. Terms of office for officers begin Sept. 1; terms of office for standing committee members begin October.
 Current practice is for committees to start winding up their work in August. In September, local committees decide on LAUC representative and outgoing chairs work on handoff with incoming chairs.  - ii. Board discussed and approved the use of the President's fund for professional development and equipment for LAUC.
- 2. PI eligibility of librarians across UC campuses
 - i. PI eligibility and procedures not uniform across campuses. On some campuses librarians can only be co-investigator with AUL or UL as PI, while affiliated librarians have automatic PI status on the same campus. On other campuses librarians can get exceptional PI status, and on some campuses they have automatic PI status. This becomes an issue for doing cross campus collaborative research.

Action: Carla to talk to Roger and help shepherd getting uniformity across campuses and PI status for every librarian next year.

 - i. Academic Personnel
 - 1. Appointments: Megan Van Noord has been appointed as Health Sciences Librarian, starting September 1, 2018 (just in time for the LAUC census).

- 2. Recruitments: All librarian-level recruitments are closed at this time. Non-librarian academic (Scholarly Communications Officer) and executive-level (Director of Finance and Senior Director of Development) recruitments are in various stages with no announcements at this time.

LAUC-D: The outgoing and incoming LAUC-D Executive Boards will be meeting next week to work on details for the implementation of the alternative leadership continuity plan for 2018-19, in the absence of a candidate for the chair role. - Personnel: Jeffrey Loo started in July as our new Clinical Librarian. Also, two new librarians started in June, Erin Glass as Digital Scholarship Librarian and Stephanie Labou as Data Science Librarian. Several open librarian positions are in recruitment, including Biological Sciences Librarian and Collection Strategist for Biology, Health, and Marine Sciences.
- ii. This week UCSD is hosting the Force11 Scholarly Communications Institute. Several librarians are taking part.
- iii. We recently hosted a HathiTrust workshop called "Digging Deeper, Reaching Further". Twelve librarians from outside our library, from Southern California and Arizona, joined twelve local librarians as participants in the workshop.
- iv. Our Library Sustainability Committee organized our participation in Plastic Free July.
- v. Staying with Millenium until systemwide ILS is robust.

- i. Personnel: Interviews for the Research Librarian for Visual Arts have concluded.
- ii. Ex Libris Primo and Alma went live on 7/30 after a brief delay.

- i. Personnel: Courtney Dean has been appointed new head of the Center for Primary Research and Training (CFPRT) as of July 31. The unit is part of the Outreach and Engagement Team of Library Special Collections. Courtney's previous UCLA Library experience includes Processing Archivist for the CFPRT. Joshua Gomez will be the new Head of Core Systems, which oversees the Library Web Services Team, effective August 6. Julia Glassman, Research & Instruction Librarian at Powell Library, is resigning effective August 17 to accept a position as Young Adult Librarian at the Goldwyn Hollywood Branch of the LA Public Library. Julia has been with UCLA since 2012. Liz Cheney, Science & Engineering Librarian, has also left UCLA to accept a position at Cal State Northridge. Nora Franco started August 1 as the new Consumer Health Librarian in NNLM PSR at the Biomedical Library. M. Wynn Tranfield will be the new Physical and Basic Sciences Librarian for the Sciences User Engagement Team effective August 8.
- ii. UCLA Scholarly Communication Librarian Jennifer Chan was selected to receive the first Library and Information Technology Association (LITA) scholarship to attend the 2018 ALA Leadership Institute, http://www.ala.org/news/member-news/2018/07/lita-awards-first-ala-leadership-institute-scholarship-jennifer-chan.

- i. - Last week's workshop by Nicole Cooke (UIUC) on Considering Cultural Competence: Reframing our LIS Pratice & Research was a success – 24 people attended including two librarians from UCSF.
- iv. Like last year, two librarians from the National Library of Technology (NTK) in the Czech Republic will be visiting Berkeley in October to learn more about our services and initiatives.
