Original Abstract as Submitted:

In the U.S. the right to vote and the use of the vote are seen as pillars of responsible citizenship and a healthy democracy.

Our poster focuses on a crucial, but somewhat allusive literature – that of electoral campaigns geared toward local multicultural communities in California's Santa Barbara and Ventura Counties. California is only mandated to collect ballot measures, campaign finances, candidate data and election results.

An initial assessment of available literature: election flyers, realia, posters, photographs, web sites, social networks, and digital media that has been collected and preserved by libraries and repositories are limited in scope. Many of our local candidates' websites from the most recent election are no longer online.

Open access to knowledge and preservation of this literature helps citizens understand past and current community issues. Our project archive will assist diverse communities to view how their representatives have articulated issues.

Our poster will include text and images of multiple formats (print, posters, pamphlets, digitized and born digital) included in the archive. We will highlight the campaign literature of local diverse communities.

In addition, this archive will serve as a foundation to understand persistent issues, formulate informed current and future strategies, solutions, and develop coalition-building efforts.

I. ACCOMPLISHMENTS and EVALUATION

• Describe what was achieved during the time period of the grant.

Our project came about as a response to the need to create an online campaign literature archives for local Santa Barbara materials that are not collected and preserved under the mandate of California State or Santa Barbara County. The archives would provide access to local political information and to a broad range of issues for diverse communities. We discovered that in a number of instances after elections occurred, websites were removed and many types of campaign printed materials were unavailable.

We began research to focus on exploring archiving tool designed to preserve and sustain local Santa Barbara political history. We discovered that UCLA had created an online campaign literature archive for Los Angeles materials, and the California Digital Library had developed a Web Archiving Service that could capture and preserve websites. These tools were explored as models for our project at UCSB.

During our research project, we applied for a poster presentation during the International Federation of Libraries and Associations (IFLA) annual conference in Gothenburg, Sweden. The conference theme was entitled, *Open access to knowledge –promoting sustainable progress*.

As a result of the responses expressed by attendees to our poster presentation during the conference, we were invited to submit a paper/panel discussion proposal for the upcoming IFLA 2012 Satellite Pre-Conference on Information for Civic Literacy in Riga, Latvia.
