The Association for the Asian American Studies (AAAS) is the primary research and teaching hub for Asian American Studies, an interdisciplinary field advocates for and supports academics and professionals in the field of Asian American Studies and ethnic studies in general. AAAS holds an annual conference that serves as a major venue where academic and community engagements and critical discussions on research, pedagogy, and professional concerns happen spontaneously during and after conference sessions. Thus, it is an ideal place for librarians and archivists to connect with scholars and community members to collaborate and discuss issues related to libraries and archives, two institutional pillars crucial to the advancement of academic research in all disciplines. Archives and libraries have traditionally been and continue to serve as places and in collaboration with archivists and librarians that support and promote teaching, community building, and the dissemination of stories and information through exhibitions, presentations and workshops.

As the convenor for Ethnic Studies – CKG, I will join a round table panel organized Dr. Eric Hung, Executive Director of the Music of Asian America Research Center to discuss salient issues around archives and libraries. Specifically, the round table will address issues that libraries and archives have encountered in recent past years: the political forces that challenge the legitimacy of these institutions; calls for broader repatriation programs; safety practices during the COVID-19 pandemic and the management and adoption of new technologies. The panel will discuss the positive work of information professionals in areas such as DEI initiatives, unionization movements, mental wellness, user experience, and community engagement
