Original Abstract as Submitted:

Interlibrary Loan (ILL) is an important service that is highly valued by faculty, students, and staff at university libraries. Providing access to information resources quickly and efficiently is an ongoing goal at our library. Internal factors such as budget cuts and reduced staffing and external factors such as the ease and affordability of on-demand purchases made the time ripe to investigate and improve interlibrary loan services. A series of pilot projects involving staff from Access Services, Collections and Acquisitions were conducted to measure the cost of new services, time to delivery and workflow constraints. These pilot projects included purchasing items on demand, using staff expertise in other departments, and using existing technology to enhance workflow.

My objective is to show how a number of small, flexible projects made a big difference in delivering content to our users more efficiently than traditional ILL. For example, the team was able to shave off five days in our turnaround time for ILL requests, while gaining new content for our library. I will present on the challenges of foreign language purchasing, how e-books and articles fit into our on-demand purchases, and decisions on which level of user could participate in our pilots. Attendees can expect to learn strategies to help change workflow using existing staff and resources, manage staff expectations, and to hear about our victories as well as our defeats.

- This advice is specifically for someone doing a poster. I had my poster printed on vinyl as opposed to paper. This meant, even with the great size (80' x 46'), that I could fold it in my carry-on bag. This made travel so much easier, especially when a person has connecting flights.
