The Chinese Cuban Elders Oral History Project is a collaborative documentation effort between UCLA Library, UCLA graduate students, and the Casa de Artes y Tradiciones Chinas in Havana, Cuba to document the experiences of Chinese Cuban elders and their descendants through oral histories. This project is part of the Cuba initiatives under UCLA Library's International Digital Ephemera Project. This talk will discuss insights gained from the initial phase of the project as well as lessons learned through coordinating a collaboration between a US academic institution and a community archive in Cuba.
