SCLG makes decisions in the areas of UC-wide collection development and management.

Highlights from 2016-2017 SCLG meetings:

- I. We have appointed two project teams to work on specific projects.
 - a. [Scholarly Transformation Advice & Review](#) (STAR) Team
 - i. STAR evaluates and make initial recommendations on UC consortial investment opportunities in potentially transformative scholarly communication initiatives.
 - ii. Any UC group may submit a request for a resource review.
 - b. UC Shared Micro Collections Review
 - i. Will inventory existing shared microfilm collections in the UC libraries and investigate which are duplicated in digital form.

- II. Licensing Issues
 - a. Tier 1 Licensing have included these vendors/products:
 - i. Taylor & Francis Journals, 2016-2018 & Archive
 - ii. Berg Fashion Library
 - iii. Cambridge University Press eBooks
 - iv. JSTOR ebooks
 - v. Sage
 - vi. Springer Nature
 - b. JSC has submitted a new cost share model for our licenses based on FTE.
 - i. This is still under discussion.
 - c. CDL updated its [Model License](#) and was approved by SCLG.
 - d. The [Tier 2 License: Step by Step website](#) and the [Tier 2 New Resource Form](#) have been updated

 - b. The [JSTOR DDA pilot](#) started in January 2017.
