Original Abstract as Submitted

I will address the intersection between ethnic studies theory and community archives practice through primary source instruction in the Asian American Studies classroom and the potential for transforming students 'experiences. In 2017 we began to implement a three-year Institute of Museum and Library Services-funded research project, "Transforming Knowledge, Transforming Libraries, "with the guiding question: what are the outcomes of undergraduate students applying what they learn in ethnic studies combined with their lived experience in contributing to community archives? The research team sought to answer this guestion by introducing community archives concepts to undergraduate students enrolled in ethnic studies courses. Through a workshop, we introduce students to community archives theory and bring primary source materials into the classroom to demonstrate how students can facilitate "representational belonging" in archives. I will address workshop design, pedagogical collaboration with Asian American Studies faculty (e.g. customization of workshops to incorporate materials that supplement the class syllabi), early findings from the students 'responses to workshop activities, and lessons learned from the first year. A central component of our research includes implementing a Summer Cohort Program where 15 students are paid to learn about community archives work and paired with local organizations to experience grassroots challenges and opportunities for supporting documentation efforts. In taking a community-centered approach to archival work, we seek to empower a new generation to transform the archival record, thus impacting the production of knowledge on, by, and for historically marginalized communities.

For this session, we had an attendance of 30 people and the feedback was positive, including several follow up consultations I provided on how to deploy community archives in the classroom.

I also chaired the graduate student session on "Refugee Dis/inheritances: Multimodal Archives, Intergenerational healing, and Differential Remembrances of the Vietnam War." This session was attended by approximately 20 people and the question and answer session was very animated.

While attending AAAS2019, I also visited the book exhibitions and selected titles to purchase for the UCI Libraries monos collection.
