Proposal Abstract (not to exceed 250 words):

This is a continuation and expansion of my research on underground printing and publishing in communist Poland, 1976-1990. In August-September 2011, as the Lasner Fellow in Printing History, I travelled to Poland to gather materials on independent printing under communism. I conducted interviews with prominent printers of the "Solidarity" movement and studied documentary materials. That trip resulted in a paper delivered at the American Printing History Association's annual conference, then turned into a scholarly article, a series of lectures, and an exhibit at Mills College. Yet the wealth of materials I brought back from Poland is far from being exhausted, and they pose even more questions that need answers. My follow up research will concentrate on clarification of many details and acquiring new information regarding the organization and logistics of printing, obtaining paper, ink and other printing components, distribution of printed matter, etc. Since my initial research was conducted mostly in Warsaw, now I am particularly interested in information about places outside of Poland's capital: Gdańsk, Poznań, Wrocław, Kraków, Lublin, et al. I will travel to these places, interview the activists and study materials preserved locally. It is undisputed that breaking the communists' monopoly in information—i.e. independent publishing, was one of the principal factors in bringing communism to its end, yet a detailed account of how underground printing worked is still to be written. I hope the ultimate result of my research will be the first comprehensive monograph in English on this historical phenomenon.

LAUC Research Grant Proposal:

Underground Printing in Communist Poland, 1976-1990

1. Need for Research

In the 1970s and 1980s, Poland saw a "paper revolution," i.e. one fought and won with (printed) paper rather than guns and bullets. Breaking the communist state's monopoly on information and restoring free public discourse began as pages typed on onionskin with carbon paper and passed around among friends. By the end of 1980s, it evolved into a sizable underground industry. Printers, "black revolutionaries," are the unsung heroes of this revolution. Whereas virtually all historical writing on Poland under communism pays tribute to (and abundantly quotes from) underground publications, there is very little information on their actual production. My research concerns primarily the production aspects of independent publishing, including printing techniques and equipment, access to resources, organization and conditions of work, obtaining supplies, innovations and inventions, distribution networks, security procedures, etc.

Although a fair amount of primary material has been gathered and recorded, still much more ground work needs to be done. There are recordings of oral history, movies, bibliographies of underground publications, even some printing equipment got preserved. Yet what is most wanting is a historical monograph comprehensively presenting underground printing and publishing industry. My objective is twofold: to gather some hitherto unrecorded material, as well as write such a monograph.

Because of the large scale of my project, it is divided into several stages. Last year, as the Lasner Fellow in Printing History, I travelled to Poland to conduct interviews with prominent printers of "Solidarity" movement and study documentary materials. That trip resulted in a paper delivered at the American Printing History Association's annual conference, then turned into a scholarly article submitted to the journal "Printing History" (as of now, I do not have information whether it has been accepted,) a series of lectures, and an exhibit at Mills College.

2. Design and Methodology

The 2012 part of my research will build upon and expand the results of my last year's travel to Poland. During that trip I limited myself primarily to Warsaw; this time I would like to also visit several provincial centers, notably Gdańsk, Poznań, Wrocław, Kraków, and Lublin. I'm planning to travel to Poland for another month-long research trip in August-September 2012. I would like to talk to people such as former "Solidarity" printers and activist such as Jacek Chmaj, Tomasz Pietrasiewicz, Szczepan Rudka, and others; I will also read the existing testimonies housed in provincial archives. Wherever possible (like in Łódź or Lublin), I will examine surviving equipment, record types and models of machines, etc. I also plan to examine archival materials of Secret Police, presently housed at the Institute of National Remembrance (IPN). This travel should result in an intermediary report that, similarly to the last year's, will be presented at 2012 APHA Annual Conference, and then turned into an article, or articles for publication in scholarly journals.

3. Budget

This budget consists of travel expenses and accommodation in Poland. By renting an apartment, I can stay at nearly three times lower rate than the official UCOP per diem allowance of \$285.00:

Dear Mr. Zlatkes,

On February 21, 2012, you submitted a Human Participants research application to the UCR Human Research Review Board (HRRB) entitled "Underground Printing in Communist Poland, 1976-1990" and during the preliminary review, the following questions were asked of you:

- 1. Could you clarify what your research question was ...
- 2. Did you have a hypothesis ...
- 3. How will your findings contribute to generalizable knowledge? (In other words, how would the knowledge gained from the study be applied to populations beyond your specific study population (underground activists and printers in Communist Poland from 1976-1990), inform policy, or generalize findings? ...

Your response was that this is an historical research and not based on proving or disproving a predetermined hypothesis; instead, it tried to reconstruct how and why certain events happened the way they did, and why a particular historical process occurred this, and not a different way. You also stated 1) your principal question was "How exactly did underground printing in Poland develop in the years 1976 to 1990?", 2) in this context, whether the knowledge gained from your study would be applied to other populations, was not a concern for a historian, 3) you included information from Linda Slopes of the Oral History Association who quotes a draft policy statement from the DHHS Office of Human Research Protections, [historians] "do not reach for generalizable principles of historical or social development; nor do they seek underlying principles or laws of nature that have predictive value and can be applied to other circumstances for the purpose of controlling outcomes" and 4) your only objective is to contribute to the historical knowledge of society.

Based on these factors, the UCR HRRB determined that given the information you provided, your study did not constitute human subjects research as defined by Federal Regulations because it was not designed to develop or contribute to generalizable knowledge (the Belmont Report defines "generalizable knowledge" as knowledge "expressed, for example, in theories, principles, and statements of relationships)" and therefore, was not subject to needing UCR HRRB review and approval.

If our understanding of your project is incorrect, please contact us so we can re-review this situation and please let me know if you have any questions.

1) I am planning to travel to Poland for six weeks, beginning August 1, 2012; contingent upon receiving the LAUC grant. This includes one week (5 work days) release time; the rest of it will be my vacation time. The signature for authorization of the release time by my supervisor Dr. Melissa Conway is on my original application, attached.

2) Most of my research will be conducted through my personal contacts. I will conduct interviews, visit the sites of underground printing, examine surviving equipment. The ultimate objective of my research is to write a monograph on underground printing in Poland, 1976-1990; this research trip is a stage in the process, very important but not the goal by itself. I plan to complete the monograph sometime in 2014. I believe the impact of my project can only be measured by the quality and importance of my book,

3) I am in ongoing personal contact with most my contacts in Poland. (BTW, the IRB Office at UCR has determined that as a historical study, my research does not involve human subjects as defined by the Federal guidelines so I does not need any special permissions or protocols -- I wonder if you received the confirmation of this? In the next mail I will forward the relevant message.) The only institution that I need to contact in advance is the Institute of the National Remembrance (IPN) in Warsaw to gain access to their documents. Their form requires to indicate the time of visiting them which I will not know before finalizing details of my trip.

4) I am not sure what other details of my budget you need. The largest items are the airfare to and from Poland (currently at approx. \$1400,) accommodation in Warsaw and in other towns in Poland (\$ 1500,) and food (\$ 1500,) which

intend to cover my entire stay in Poland.

The Supplemental Budget Form for the grant requires using University UCDP: Maximum Travel Per Diem Allowances for Foreign Areas, Section 925, Supplement to the Standardized Regulations, (Government Civilians, Foreign Areas) U.S. State Department. (http://www.ucop.edu/ucophome/policies/bfb/g281.pdf) which is currently close to \$300 per day -- I was utterly confused by this.)
